ASI Encourages the San Luis Obispo Council of Governments to Provide Adequate Funding to the
City of San Luis Obispo Transit System

- WHEREAS: Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) is the official voice of Cal Poly students, and
- WHEREAS: Cal Poly students and staff comprised 58% (1,103,445) of the riders on SLO Transit from July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2007. SLO Transit carries approximately 3,000 to 4,000 Cal Poly students and staff per average workday, and
- WHEREAS: The SLO Transit service promotes the university's goals of establishing a means of travel that enhances the environment and lowers traffic congestion. It promotes a sustainable way of living and encourages students to find better means of traveling, and,
- WHEREAS: Providing adequate parking for students and staff has proved to be a struggle for the university. Thus, SLO transit disallows more detrimental consequences to an already existing problem, and
- WHEREAS: SLO Transit provides students, staff, and faculty a safe way to commute at night. The extended bus hours have proved to be immensely advantageous for safety and convenience purposes, and.
- WHEREAS: SLO Transit provides a connection from student and staff's homes to Cal Poly and downtown. It encourages more students and staff to travel to these regions and thus, attracts more business.
