**A.** Brett reported on noise violations. March had 198 noise complaints, 83 DACS and 19 citations. He stated that between 10 PM and 3 AM there were 154 calls.

**B.** Brandon reported that 16 student leaders will be attending California Higher Education Student Summit (CHESS) where they will be lobby on behalf of students against the proposed budget cuts. He stated that some students will tour Sacramento State University to research their Safe Ride Program.

**V. Business/Discussion Items**

**A. Update: Town Gown Conference-Ken Hampian**

Ken stated that the program committee has developed three proposed conference tracks which include Service and Sustainability, Prosperity & Economic Impact and Healthy Relations. Service and Sustainability track will spotlight ways of mutually and more economically delivering public services. This track will also highlight partnership for sustainability. Prosperity and Economic Impact track will prove the economic impact of universities on host communities. It will also address succession planning and next generation issues. Healthy Relations track will spotlight innovative programs for strengthening neighborhood relations, improving conflict resolution and institutionalizing excellent communication between university and city officials and among students, university & city representatives.

**B. Update: Neighborhood Policing and Traffic Safety Improvements-Deb Linden**

Deb reported that the program formerly known as Neighborhood Enhancement Team now Neighbor Team will be presented at the City Council meeting on May 6. She stated that the team will patrol from 3 p.m. to 3 a.m. She shared a new graffiti website to be launched shortly. The website will streamline reporting graffiti by emailing directly to the city properties such as newspaper racks, San Luis Garbage, AT&T, post office, etc. The police department will receive a copy of the report as well.

Gene reported on the Neighborhood Wellness program. He explained with the ½-cent sales tax increase, which passed in 2006, resulted in a forecast of \$5.1 million annually in added General Fund revenues in the 2007-09 Financial Plan. The added revenue supported the city's need for major improvements in key areas of the community including, strengthening code enforcement, improving public safety, reducing and managing traffic congestion, improving flood protection, enhancing senior services and restoring funding for open space preservation. He explained the key objectives, projects strategy and the key issues of the project scope.
