I. Call to Order

Angela Kramer, Chair of SCLC, called the October meeting to order @ 3:32 p.m.

II. Approval of Minutes

IV. Open Forum

A. Dr. Morton updated members on the Crops House incident. He stated that the Campus Climate Committee has been meeting daily and written statements from departments on campus in response to the incident have been written. He stated that the campuswide community forum held at the PAC was successful and well attended. President Baker, Dr. Morton, Dean Wehner and Angela spoke on diversity. Students and community also had the opportunity to speak during an open mic session.

B. Brett presented the noise violations for October with 407 calls. He stated calls were up by 30% from 2007. There were 219 DACS and 39 citations. He stated that Halloween played a part in the increase in numbers.

V. Business/Discussion Items

A. SCLC Memorandum of Understanding

Angela presented the revised Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to add the annual budget. The new MOU will begin January 1, 2009.

B. Proposal for Night Rider Program

Angela explained the 15 week pilot program as an option for safe transportation in the evenings called Night Rider. The anticipated cost of operation is approximately \$38,000 annually with a tentative start date of mid-February of 2009. She stated that the goal was to be free a free service to students but would be a one way service from downtown to home. She stated that it is not the intention to take business away from taxi services but to provide an alternate safe ride home. The program will work in conjunction with Ride-On and student volunteers will monitor rides. Other partners include University President, Vice President of Student Affairs, Cal Poly Corporation and Pacific Beverage Company. At the end of the pilot program, an evaluation process will take place. ASI will develop and conduct a survey to assess the effectiveness of the program. Angela stated she was looking for an endorsement.
