**I. Call to Order**

Angela Kramer, Chair of SCLC, called the January meeting to order @ 3:32 p.m.

**II. Approval of Minutes**

**IV. Open Forum**

Adam Serafin reported on the See the Need Week for Student Community Services at Cal Poly. He stated that 13,000 lbs. of food was collected which was the largest gross for the Food Bank and that they collected Holiday gifts for over 400 kids. He reported that the CSU Impact Newsletter featured two Cal Poly events with pictures.

**V. Community Reports**

**A. ASI President-Angela Kramer  
Night Rider Update**

Angela reported that progress was continuing with the Night Rider program. She stated that the Greek Organizations were being asked to volunteer to be monitors in the van. She is working on finding the best way to achieve continuity from year to year. Logos are being created and Angela stated that she should have something to show this body by next meeting.

**B. ASCC President-Joseph Vanherweb**

Drew Verdi reported that school was not in session so things were quiet. He stated that Cuesta would also like to be involved in the Night Rider Program. Dr. Fontanilla stated that RTA was providing free bus rides from January 20-February 6 to encourage attendance during the first few weeks of school.

**C. City Manager-Ken Hampian**

Ken reported that the City is working with an \$11M budget gap and stated that the task at hand was to find ways to make adjustments including cutting capital expenses, city positions and hoping for no layoffs. He stated there are currently 20 vacancies and the city has implemented a hiring freeze. He stated there will be a community forum to address council priorities for setting goals for the next two years.

**D. Residents for Quality Neighborhoods-Brett Cross**

Brett reported that noise violations were down due to the holiday. He stated there were 232 DACS issued in November in comparison to 250 in 2007. In December there were 113 calls, 53 DACS and 12 citations.

**VI. Business/Discussion Items**

**A. SCLC Memorandum of Understanding**

Angela explained that every January the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) must be signed by all entities. This new MOU includes the addition for the \$500 budget to be invoiced every January to City of San Luis Obispo, County of San Luis Obispo, Cuesta College and ASI. All four entities signed the document.

**B. Proposed Modifications to City Social Host Ordinance**

Deb presented the proposed modifications to the City Social Host Ordinance. She stated that the purpose of the modifications is to hold the party host accountable and it creates a law to address underage drinking. She reported that one of the problems is minors are obtaining alcohol at off campus parties. The risks associated included sexual assaults, DUI's, alcohol poisoning, etc. Proposed changes include changing the law to a misdemeanor instead of an infraction and reduce the number of minors present who are consuming alcohol i.e. three minors, one consuming alcohol. She stated that these changes are consistent with industry standard or consistent with related laws i.e. minor in possession. Deb stated that the next step will be to obtain feedback through presentations before it goes to City Council for approval. She reiterated that this is not a college ordinance but a city ordinance. She reported that current fines are \$100 first conviction, \$200 second and \$500 third conviction in comparison to other counties at \$750/\$1500/\$2500.

**C. Greek Summit Update**

Harmony Quismundo-Newman, Coordinator for Greek Affairs, reported on the Greek Summit and stated that the feeling at the end of the summit was phenomenal. The event began with teambuilding activities with Panhellenic, Interfraternity Council and United Fraternity and Sorority Council. Discussion included learning how to have difficult conversations. Student leaders stated they didn't realize the impact of the incident and that the future of Greeks was in their hands. Saturday events included presentation from Creative Mediation to learn how to facilitate tough conversations. Sunday included events with administrators. She stated that students understood what it would take to "clean up" Greek Life and reiterated that the hardest part would be to teach other student leaders by holding themselves accountable. She announced that the Greek Academy will be held on February 7 and should include 300-400 students.

**A. Special Events-Angela Kramer**

Angela stated that the committee did not meet. She stated that Executive Cabinet is discussing a Community Appreciation event that could be a potential option to SLO Night with your Neighbor.

**B. SLO Solutions – Amy Stapp**

Amy reported that the posters had been approved and is now on some community buses. Their goal was to have the posters on all buses.

**C. Community Relations-Connor Johnston**

Conner reported that the community/student survey has been sent out to students to find out how students think the community views them and how students view the community. He is looking for help on how to reach community members to take the survey.
