A. ASI President – Sarah Storelli

1. WOW recap – Andrene Kaiwi-Lenting

Sarah introduced Andrene Kaiwi-Lenting, Assistant Director, and Coordinator of Orientation Programs to give a recap on Week of Welcome (WOW).

Andrene stated that WOW introduced a new perspective on addressing drugs and alcohol including an Awareness Exhibit on topics such as stress & depression, mental health, university living, drugs & alcohol, and sexual assault.

Jason Mockford, Assistant Coordinator for Orientation Programs, stated that other events included a Day of Service where students helped 23 organizations in the county collecting 190 coats and 563 canned goods. Other events included SLO Bound, Bike Night, two movies at the Fremont Theater, and a bonfire at Port San Luis.

2. Get Your Green On – Sarah Storelli

Sarah announced that the Cal Poly, Get Your Green On campaign will begin on Thursday with a rally to include athletic teams, coaches, cheerleaders, Cal Poly band, and Take it SLO an A Cappella group. Campus spirit partners include ASI, Mustang Maniacs, Cal Poly Athletics, Campus Dining, University Housing, and El Corral Bookstore. They are offering prizes and rewards to students wearing green. The campaign will continue every Thursday.

B. ASCC President Elect – Leah Cheney

Leah reported that Cuesta held a successful police forum informing students of new city ordinances.

She stated that she will be appointing Executive Cabinet officers soon.

Upcoming events include Week of Advocacy, a letter writing campaign urging passing of the budget, and a golf tournament.

Leah reported that ASCC endorsed a program called Grass Roots which is a garden for students.

She stated that Cuesta is looking into an alert text message system.
