V. Community Reports

A. ASI President – Sarah Storelli

Sarah announced there is currently \$2,500 in the SCLC budget after donating \$1,000 to SLO Night with Your Neighbor

She stated that three presidential candidates will come to Cal Poly campus on November 30 – December 2. Student forums will be held at 10 a.m.

Sarah reported that ASI Student Government is in the planning stages for an event called Active Living: Sustaining your Health & Wellness to be held on January 18 in the University Union. She stated that 22 on and off campus groups have been contacted to participate in the event.

Sarah reiterated the importance of attendance to SCLC meetings stating that quorum has not been met since we increased the number of voting members.

Katie introduced Jan Marx who will take office as SLO City Mayor on December 1. She stated that her new position will leave a vacancy on City Council and that traditionally Council will elect a new member. If an appointment is not made within 30 days a special election must be held.

She reported that Halloween/Homecoming weekend was considerably busy; however, noise violation numbers were down. She stated that 28 police officers were on duty in comparison to 12 on a normal weekend.

A. SCLC Goals Task Force

Sarah asked members to read the goals previously created to see if these were still goals SCLC wants to continue with. The members agreed that these are good goals and the focus should be on an education campaign. Make students understand what it means to be a community member. Educate them on what they should do, not

focusing on what they shouldn't be doing, i.e. leaving couches on lawns, let them know ways of recycling or disposing. Understand that when full red cups or broken glass are left behind in the evening, children find them in the morning. Encourage ownership; this is where you live understand the level of respect in the community. Appeal to the sense of responsibility as students are high achievers and want to contribute to society. Create a consistent campaign with a specific message. Other ideas included encouraging students to get involved in the community by applying for Advisory Committees or City Commissions. It was suggested that outreach should be expanded to include Tribune, New Times, and Facebook.

The next step entails talking to faculty to see if there is a class that is willing to create a campaign or possibly as a senior project.

B. Website Task Force

Gen stated that website brainstorming ideas included creating a video explaining SCLC, show pictures from SLONWN or SCLC meetings, garage sale information, FAQ's. Additional links will include City website, SLO Solutions, University Housing, and links to volunteer opportunities.
