V. Community Reports

A. ASI President – Sarah Storelli

Sarah announced that it was a unanimous decision in the recommendation for the presidential candidate. She stated that the Chancellor will make a decision soon. Marketing strategies to inform students was a campuswide email, student forums to meet the candidates, and videos of candidate forums. She stated that feedback was collected from email and conversations from students and forwarded to the Chancellor. She reiterated the importance of student feedback.

Sarah reported that UUAB is conducting a Recreation Center Outreach Campaign to find out what students want to see at the Rec Center when it opens. They are asking what other activities would attract students that do not normally go to the gym.

She stated that the search continues for Vice President of Advancement and Athletics Director.

Sarah reported that Lobby Corps is being developed to lobby on behalf of education at the local and state level. Bylaws are being created to institutionalize Lobby Corps by June to carry on from year to year.

Sarah announced the Active Living: Sustain your Health & Wellness Fair to take place on January 18. On and off campus entities will participate in promoting healthy living.

Katie stated that the budget process is well underway with goal setting. She encouraged students to attend the Community Forum on January 11 as they want student opinion. She stated that a report will be presented to council on January 29.

She stated that the training will provide information on how the process works, how students can engage with city officials and address City Council, and what is the most effective way for students to give input and collaborate in a healthy way.

Noise violations are down 22 % and trends are consistent since the noise ordinances began. There has been a dramatic reduction in complaints and not as many large parties.

A. Outreach Campaign Update

Rick stated that an ASI staff member is reaching out to a PR & Marketing group of students to look at the SCLC campaign. If they are unable to do it, a professional organization will be contacted to take on the project. The goal is to provide a structured campaign to see what we are doing and what we should be doing as a community group. The project will begin in January and will be completed by the end of the year.

B. SLO Garage/Yard Sale

Ardith reported that Santa Barbara holds an annual garage sale to sell/recycle unwanted furniture, etc. that students moving out no longer want. She reported that they earned \$27,000 last year and the profits were given to non-profit organizations in the community. She stated that it would take a great deal of community help to make it successful. Other suggestions on groups that might be interested in helping include Student Community Services, Empower Poly Coalition, Good Neighbor Program, Greek Life, and Creative Mediation. A key component is to educate parents letting them know that there are ways to eliminate trash upon move out.

C. SLO Community Brochures

Anthony distributed a brochure suggesting that SCLC create a brochure about living in the community, how to be part of the community and how to make the most of it. Ardith stated that they have brochures on Living in the Neighborhood and How to be a Good Neighbor. It was suggested that we develop an electronic document and add to a medium that students use such as Facebook, Twitter or UTube. A Guide to Living in the Community can be created on behalf of SCLC and sent electronically to all admitted students, through the Cal Poly Parent Program, and campus tours.
