Sarah announced that a nationwide search has opened by the President's Office in search of the next Chief of Staff at Cal Poly.

She reported that 12 members from ASI Student Government will travel to Sacramento for the California Higher Education Student Summit (CHESS) conference this month. She stated the purpose of the conference is to bring all the California State University Systems together to lobby at the State Capital as a whole state system.

Sarah introduced Kelly Leggoe and Anna Consani from Cal Poly's Open House Committee. They stated that this year is the 18<sup>th</sup> annual Open House to be held on April 14-16. This year's theme is Polywood and the grand marshal is Ken Barclay, Executive Director of Student Life & Leadership. Main events include Thursday; Farmers Market Club Preview and Friday; a Resource Fair, campus tours, and Friday Night Invite. Saturday events include Poly Royal Parade, opening ceremonies, the truck & tractor pull, and a rodeo.

Katie stated that the city is not recommending adding fund reductions to SCLC and SLO Solutions.
