I. Call to Order

- a. Jasmin called the meeting to order at 3:10 p.m.

II. Approval of Minutes

V. Community Reports

a. ASI President-Jasmin Fashami

- i. Jasmin reported that she is the only ASI student leader on campus and has been participating in the SLO Days presentations and meet & greet meetings with administration.
- ii. She stated that the Leadership Team will be back in office on August 1 and training will begin.

b. ASCC President - Jordan Jantzen

- i. Absent
- ii. Mark commended Jordan and Anthony Gutierrez for their hard work on the food pantry serving over 600 students. Anthony added that a location in north county will open in the fall.
- iii. Mark stated that Cuesta received the California Catalyst Fund of \$125,000 for one year to establish a dreamers' center.
- iv. He stated that grants were received for expanding the Veterans Resource Center and for mental health support.
- v. He announced that Dr. Jill Stearns will serve as the new president of Cuesta College.

c. City Manager – Derek Johnson

- i. Jasmin tabled Derek’s report until his arrival.

d. Residents for Quality Neighborhoods – Carolyn Smith

- i. Carolyn stated that from January – June 30 calls were up from last year by 31 noise complaints.
- ii. She stated that a city council candidate was a guest at their meeting. She clarified that RQN does not endorse any candidate.
- iii. Juventino stated that discussion items for SCLC could include safety, cars and parking off campus. Jasmin stated that ASI will focus on promoting alternative transportation again. The common theme for SCLC discussion was safety as a priority.

e. City Manager – Derek Johnson

- i. Derek reported that Council adopted the 2018-19 budget. He stated that allocation for funding doubled for lighting and tree trimming to provide more light from already existing lights.
- ii. He announced that Council approved the San Luis Ranch/Prado over pass project as a big milestone.
- iii. He spoke about the concerns with the downtown development and traffic stating that the development for improvements was approved a decade ago.
- iv. Derek reported that parking districts are of interest in the community stating that neighborhoods are turning into parking lots for students. With the closure of the parking structure and freshmen not allowed to bring a car to campus, they are pushing cars into the community. A review of the parking and access plan and alternative transportation will be reviewed and to taking into consideration the uptake on trends.
- v. He stated that the Planning Commission will discuss setting policy for cannabis overlay zones, manufactured testing and retail distribution. A report will be presented to Council on September 4.

- a. Jasmin stated that historically, the SCLC meetings are scheduled for the third Thursday of each month unless otherwise noted. For 2018-19, only the March 14 meeting is the second week due to Cal Poly finals schedule.
