I. Call to Order

- a. Jasmin called the meeting to order at 3:14 p.m.

II. Approval of Minutes

- a. **Motion #1 (Watkins/Smith) “Move to approve the minutes from meeting #19-02, July 19, 2018.”**
- b. **Motion passed unanimous voice vote.**

III. Introductions

- a. Silent roll call was taken and introductions were made. With 12 voting members in attendance, quorum was met.
- b. Jasmin talked about the purpose of the committee and pertinent topics of discussion for SCLC. Topics included safety, housing, community/student connection, parking, civility & conversations, bicycles, mental illness, crime, traffic and sustainability. She stated that SCLC has a substantial budget she asked committee members to bring ideas to the group on potential educational campaigns.

V. Community Reports

a. ASI President-Jasmin Fashami

- i. Jasmin reported that the ASI leadership team participated in the CSUnity Conference with 23 California State Universities. Following the conference, the students met with staff for a 2-day retreat.
- ii. She stated that she is speaking at orientation and WOW about the importance of voter registration and civic engagement.

b. ASCC President – Jordan Jantzen

- i. Absent
- ii. Anthony reported that Cuesta is back in session and the north county campus food pantry is now open.

c. City Manager – Derek Johnson

- i. Derek announced that there are three mayoral candidates and seven council member candidates for this year's election.
- ii. He stated that the city is focusing on development projects. With the hotel construction downtown finishing, it should provide relieve to the downtown construction.
- iii. He reported that new vehicle charging stations will be installed. The funding comes from a grant from PG&E.
- iv. He stated that the Planning Commission will present acquisitions to Council for open space adjacent to Cal Poly.
- v. Derek reported that to avoid safety issues, designated locations for Uber and Lyft drop off zones will be reviewed.
- vi. He stated that the Irish Hills Conservation Plan update will include trails and open space.

d. Residents for Quality Neighborhoods – Carolyn Smith

- i. Carolyn reported that noise is a continued topic at the Board of Directors meeting. Other discussion includes crimes, vandalism, and fighting.
- ii. She expressed her concerns about all of the new students out on the streets in crowds and car burglaries that occur during the academic year. She stated that locking doors and windows should be stressed during orientation.

VI. Business/Discussion Items

a. SLO Solutions Brand Refresh & Digital Social Marketing Strategy

- i. Samantha Introduced Kelly Donohue to present a refresh to the SLO Solutions marketing materials. Kelly stated that after a rebrand of the Wilshire Health & Community Services that it was a good time to update SLO Solutions materials as well. The goal of the brand refresh is to reach a broad and diverse audience, add modern fonts, new photos, bold colors and simple statements to catch the eye and capture the sentiment of what it feels to be “in conflict.” She asked members for their help to distribute posters, business cards and social media posts.

b. Move in /WOW/ yak?itʏutʏu

- i. Brandon Martin, New Student & Transition Programs, gave an update on WOW activities. WOW will be held on September 16-21. He stated that events will be occurring every night on and off campus in hopes of keeping students busy through WOW.
- ii. Jo Campbell, Executive Director University Housing, gave an overview on the new housing yak?itʏutʏu. She stated that there are an additional 1,475 beds, 492 parking spaces and 872 bicycle parking spaces. She stated that Cal Poly has been working very closely with University

Police and parking for move in and have a detailed plan in place. Courtney added that time slots have been implemented for unloading and moving in. Concern was expressed for students that bring cars and park them in the neighborhoods. Courtney reiterated that messaging has been very clear to freshman NOT to bring cars to campus or the city. Jo announced yakʔitʔutʔu open house on September 4 from 4-6 p.m. and the Grand Opening on November 8. She encouraged members to learn about yakʔitʔutʔu and the Northern Chumash Tribe.
